

Little Chester Conservation Area Street Lighting Design



Lighting Design Summary

Enhancing the area with Victorian style lanterns on 7 new streets and extending the scheme on Chester Green Road.

The design adds heritage lanterns to seven new streets in the conservation area plus extending an existing scheme.

Area Background:

Little Chester was designated a Conservation Area in September 1991 in recognition of its historic character and townscape value. The area was incorporated into the Borough of Derby in the 1550's but has an even older history.

The origins of Little Chester can be traced back to the period of the Roman occupation, when a settlement called Derventio was established as early as AD69-76. Considerable remains from this period have been found in

the area. The remains of stone walls can be seen amongst the modern houses off Marcus Street; these mark the location of the commercial and administrative core, but the settlement itself extended well beyond this.

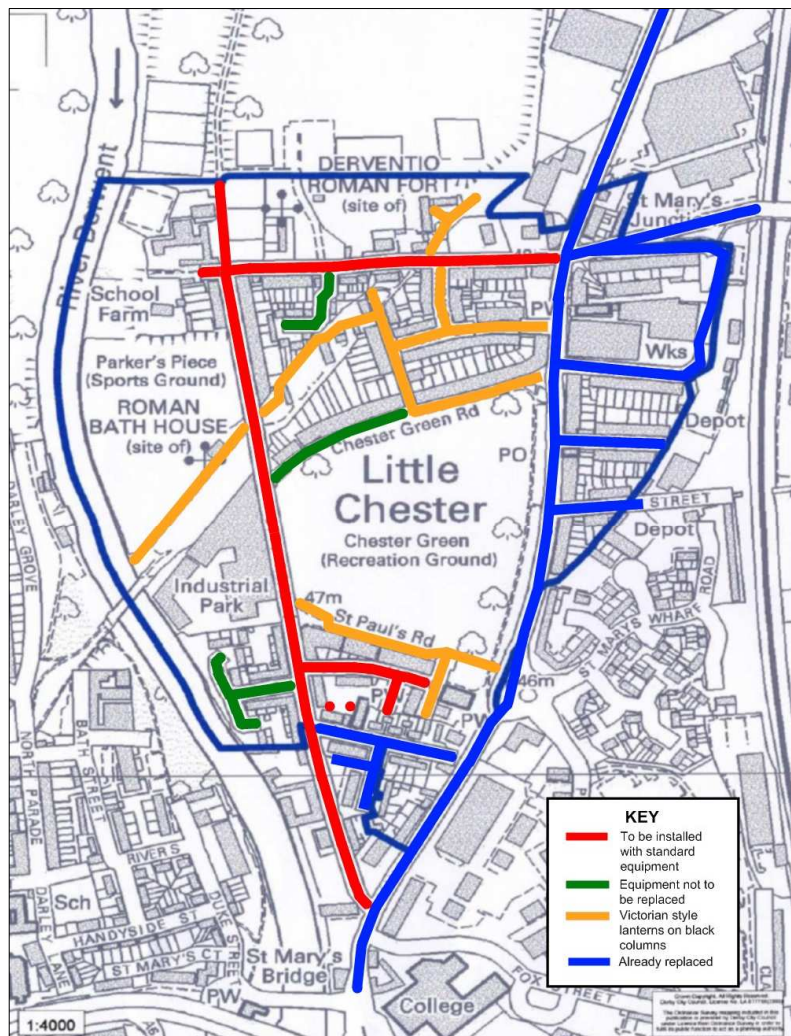
Lighting Requirements:

The lighting levels have been provided by the Derby City Council street lighting department as part of the PFI bid for street lighting in the city and meet the latest UK and European standards for road and footpath lighting.

The lighting design uses white light for residential areas and provides a significantly improved level of light for residents.

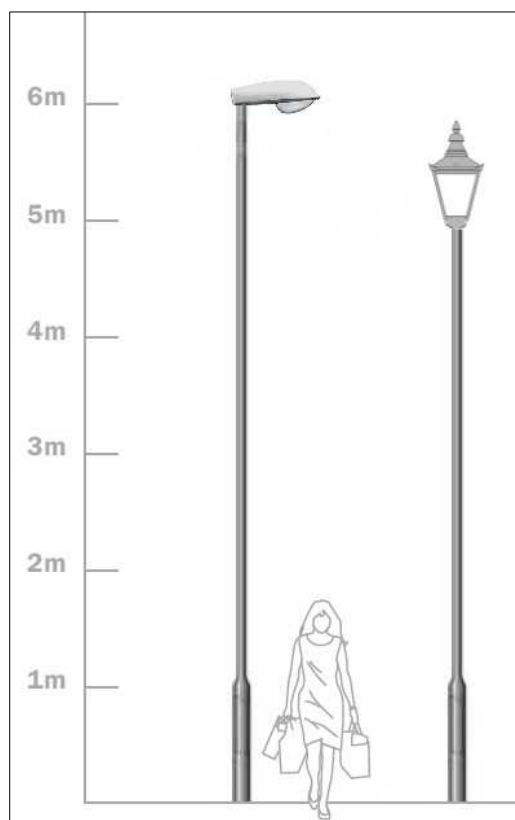
The map to the right shows a breakdown of the agreed design for the area with the dark blue line showing the conservation area boundary.
