Flood Defence News

The Project Engineer for "Our City Our River" gave a talk on the Flood Defence Scheme for our area to a packed hall of local residents on 8th May. They are working to write a business case by the end 2013 to unlock the 'indicative' £35 million potentially available from the government for Derby flood defence. If successful the aim would be to start construction in March 2015.

In the meantime the current flood insurance deal between the insurance industry and the government which guarantees insurers provide flood insurance at a reasonable cost has been extended for another month until the end of July.

Little Chester Ale House Planning Application

Little Chester Ale House at 4a Chester Green Road have applied to remove the condition on their original planning permission, in which the City Council's Environmental Health Officer objected to the rear yard/garden (which is adjoined at both sides by residential gardens) being used by customers in connection with the business, on grounds of noise nuisance. Note that if the application is granted, smoking would be permissible in the rear yard/garden.
