**Loss of Community Centre Garden ?**

We understand from recent discussions between the Environment Agency & residents living near the Community Centre that latest proposals for flood defences will involve the loss of Chester Green Community Centre's garden. The LCRA have written to the lead council officer at Our City Our River with a copy to Chris Williamson MP

requesting confirmation and justification for this proposal being the only option available, as this would result in the loss of an important amenity for the community. Or that tomatoes, cucumbers and aubergines can be grown outside just as successfully as in a greenhouse?

If you fancy giving it a go, or have left it too late to get your seeds in then Little Chester Allotments, off Old Mansfield Road, Derby are holding a **Plant Sale Open Day on Sunday May 18th from 11am until 3pm.**
