RESIDENTS' PARKING SCHEME

Council Letter

All properties affected in Chester Green in the City Rd and Old Chester Rd triangle, Vivian St., Roman Rd., Auriga Court, Drage St. and Caesar St. should now have received the letter from Derby City Council informing residents about the proposed temporary residents permit parking scheme to be introduced on 4th January 2016.

Flood Defence Disruption

The no cost scheme is intended to minimise disruption to residents and their visitors for the next two years during flood defence construction work which will result in the loss of several off street car parks.

The permit parking scheme will operate between 8am and 6pm, seven days a week. The "Access Only" restrictions on Chester Green Rd., Mansfield St., John Lombe Drive and Seale St. will be temporarily revoked during the scheme as the council say the restriction will become redundant following the introduction of residents permit parking.

Six month Trial

Once the scheme commences there is a period of six months where residents and other members of the public have the opportunity to comment and object to the restriction. The council will then decide whether to make the scheme permanent, modify it or abandon it.

The letter says that the council will write again in early December informing how to apply for permits and providing more details on how the scheme will work.

Assurances to be sought

Having received no detailed discussion on the scheme, the Residents Association will be requesting assurances on issues including

- visitor access to residents,
- visitor access for churches, community centre and businesses
- multiple vehicle ownership

to ensure all issues have been properly considered and catered for in the proposed permit scheme.

Prepare for an emergency - using your mobile phone

- If you need to ring the emergency services on your mobile and you are unable to get a good signal to ring 999, ring 112 instead. This is because 112 uses GPS technology, the same as in a Sat Nav, so the signal goes upwards rather than sideways via BT and the emergency services are able to pinpoint the location of a 112 call to within a few feet rather than to within a quarter of a mile through 999.
- It is a good idea to have at least one ICE (In Case of Emergency) number in your mobile directory. The emergency services then know who to contact if you are in an accident or taken ill and unable to make the call yourself. You simply need to put ICE next to the name of the person you would wish to be contacted. You can have more than one contact by using ICE1, ICE2, ICE3 etc.
