Our City Our River – Project Update

First report from 'Our City Our River' the Flood Defence Project Team , who have agreed to provide regular updates in the News Letter.

Work is now well and truly underway in the Chester Green and Darley Playing Field areas. We now have two site compounds set up; the main site compound is located on the former car park adjacent to Aida Bliss and Parker's Piece. We have also completed the tree and vegetation removal required before the next stage of work begins.

In the coming weeks, the first stage of the construction of the flood defence walls will start in Etruria Gardens. We are contacting residents about where work is due to take place near their properties.

Work has started on the archaeology work near the Chester Green Community Centre and this part of the project has been getting a lot of attention. We were pleased to see many local people contacting us to volunteer to help process the many artefacts being found in the trenches. We have also been getting quite a bit of coverage in the Derby Telegraph and on Radio Derby and we will be continuing to update you on the progress of the archaeology work as it progresses.

The next information drop-in session is at the **Chester Green Community Centre on Tuesday 5th April from 3.00pm to 6.45pm** and we will have some examples of the materials we will be using for the flood defence walls and there will be an opportunity to talk to the Our City Our River project team. Residents Association Meeting with Our information for residents. City Our River team

Representatives from the LCRA met with members of the OCOR team and Cllr Stanton on 16 March to discuss progress on the Flood Defence Scheme. They agreed to ensure on-going communication and consultation with local residents through:

- Regular Drop In sessions the first is on Tues 5th April between 3.00 and 6.45 at Chester Green Community **Centre.** People are encouraged to come along to ask questions or raise concerns with members of the OCOR team
- Updates from the team will be included in our Newsletter (see back page)
- Weekly afternoon open office drop in sessions at one of the site offices in the compound on the car park.

The team responded to local concerns that the white hoarding around the site compound is both an eye sore and a target for graffiti. They are proposing to look into ways to soften it to make it blend into the area through colouring etc.

Publicly funded flood defences around Chester Green are projected to complete by March 2018. The team are aware of local concerns about the lack of any timescale for completion of *privately* funded flood defences on the former factory sites.

They are considering ways in which this might be included as part of the current work. They understand that a planning application is expected shortly for the Tomlinson's site but there are no current plans for the Aida/Bliss site.

OCOR will also try to make available information about flood defence/ alleviation measures taking place upstream.

They will also look into making available 'What To Do In The Event of a Flood'

We asked if there had been any 'rethink' about our local scheme following the floods in other parts of the country over Xmas and New Year. They agreed to ask the Environment Agency for a response.

Finally we reiterated our concerns that any new residential developments on the former factory sites would not be covered by the national RE insurance agreement and the problems this would pose. The OCOR team agreed to look into this.

Consultation on City Road Factory Sites

Many residents are concerned about the type of development that might be proposed for the factory sites on City Road, especially the possibility of high rise, high density residential developments that have appeared in parts of Chester Green in recent years. These would be out of character of the area and would increase the volume of traffic using City Road.

We are therefore organising:

- A questionnaire to ascertain the views of residents
- A drop in session on Thursday 14 April between 6.00 and 8.00pm at St Pauls Church Hall on Seale St. Please make sure your views are heard!

Meeting with our MP

Amanda Solloway, Derby North MP accepted our invitation and came to Chester Green on 24/3/16 to discuss the flood defense scheme and concerns about the future development, timescales and insurance constraints of the two privately owned City Rd sites.

As mentioned above the two sites are key to achieving improved flood defense of Chester Green and many of the 2000 properties in Derby which are currently at risk of flooding.
