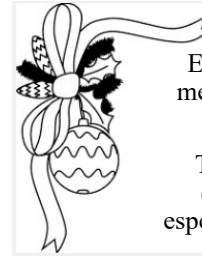
What can be done? It is going to be a long job because the only way to change this and stop this sort of thing happening again is to help everyone learn respect and community spirit.

Council will construct Flood Defences on City Road Industrial Sites.

OCOR (Our City Our River) have confirmed that "Due to the uncertainty around timescales for delivery of the Aida Bliss and ex Tomlinson's sites, the Council have decided to use the Environment Agency's Powers of Entry under the Water Resources Act 1991 to construct the proposed flood defences on these sites. This will ensure flood defences are completed by Spring 2018 in line with the other OCOR package one works".

Cricket on Parkers Piece

In response to our questions about the future of cricket on Parkers Piece, Hilary Nemes, the City Council's Parks Development Officer has said that "Reinstatement of cricket at Parker's Piece is within the OCOR project plan. This work is to include a pitch drainage scheme (subject to approval by Heritage England), relocation and installation of new cricket nets and installation of an artificial turf wicket. Future provision, including use of allocated section 106 funding and partnership funding may consider replacement of the existing cricket pavilion and refurbishment of the existing football changing facilities". Members of Darley Abbey and Derbyshire Disabled Cricket Clubs have told us they have been in

discussions with the City Council about possibly setting up a trust to try to ensure that cricket continues to be played on Parkers Piece once flood defence works are completed.
