The Flood Defence Progress update

Residents' Association members met with the Flood Defence (OCOR) team and local councillors in February to discuss progress on the project. The following issues were discussed:

Completion Date April 2018

Funding for Phase one of the project, which includes Chester Green, is secure and the work should be completed by April 2018. This would mean that our local area should have all the flood defences in place.

Office Block Plan for Tomlinsons' site

The council has agreed a proposal to build two three storey office blocks on the former Tomlinson's site and planning application is expected imminently.

Aida Bliss Site

- The Council have reached agreement in principle with owners of the Aida/Bliss factory site to purchase it. This would enable the erection of the flood defences to the rear of the buildings. The buildings would be demolished and secured leaving the facade facing the Green standing. Subsequent to the completion of the flood defences the council would then sell the land for building development.
- Part of the agreement with the Aida/ Bliss owners included the development of part of the City Road garage area for secure parking for the current Aida/ Bliss employees. After many comments from residents the design for this will be resubmitted with a design and materials that are more in keeping with the area.

FLOOD ON MANSFIELD ROAD

The water main which burst in the early hours of Sunday morning 19th March causing homes to be evacuated, major flooding, disruption to water supply, traffic and loss of local bus services was discussed at the quarterly meeting of the Neighbourhood Board the following day.

Neighbourhood Board

The Board, made up of ward councillors, neighbourhood officers and residents, was keen to ensure that any vulnerable or isolated residents were identified as soon as possible to enable them to outline any assistance they required. Neighbourhood Officers and Darren Palmer, the Darley Local Area Coordinator, went door knocking on Tuesday and Wednesday to support residents. Darren works for social services, providing support and advice and can be contacted on 078123 007634.

Shuttle Bus

A free shuttle bus to take residents to the City Centre and back was arranged by Severn Trent from Thursday 23rd March.

Public Meeting

A public meeting was held in Centurion Walk Common Room on 27th March with Councillors Eldret and Repton and three representatives from Severn Trent in attendance. Residents from the affected streets were invited to discuss the incident and their concerns.

Residents who attended were unhappy at the distress caused by the lack of immediate response and support provided by Severn Trent and the Police.

Insurance

There was anger that Severn Trent's insurance offer which does not provide 'new for old' compensation is causing stress and will result in residents being out of pocket or unable to replace damaged property, through no fault of their own.

Severn Trent

Severn Trent representatives were tasked to promptly review their insurance offer and also to identify the causes of this incident and the previous serious burst main which happened nearby eighteen months ago, with the aim of preventing any reoccurence.
