Severn Trent Water

Chris Williamson MP has replied to our letter requesting that he again write to Severn Trent Water (STW) to ask what is being done to prevent reoccurrence of a number of serious burst mains incidents in Chester Green. Chris replied to us attaching a copy of the strongly worded letter he has written to Liv Garfield, Chief Executive of STW.

Some residents have confirmed they have received a letter from STW with notification of plans to check pipes and carry out essential maintenance work overnight between 19th to 21st March.

It has been reported that some residents affected by the flooding in March 2017 have been offered compensation by STW. Other affected residents we have spoken to were unaware of any offer.

Little Chester Residents' Association LATEST NEWS ON FLOOD DEFENCE

Delays and Doubts

The construction work on the Flood Defences by the OCOR team continues to drag on and many local residents have become jaded, disillusioned and doubtful if it will ever be finished.

The completion date of end of March 2018 for Phase 1 (which includes Chester Green) will clearly not now be met. Amongst the causes of the delay are the difficulties experienced in Sowter Road and the corner of City Road owing to services, bricklaying teams leaving the project for other contracts and the delay in the completion of the purchase by the Council of the Aida factory site.

Aida Site Safety Issues

The Health and Safety assessment of the Factory has been carried out by the Council and measures to ensure the safety and security of the building are identified and funding agreed to address these.

This is to ensure that, following purchase, the Council does not have responsibility for an unsafe and dangerous property. These measures will include the continuation of 24/7 security.

Tree felling at City Road Garages Site

Residents will have seen the tree felling preparatory work in the City Road garages

area (to provide a parking compound for future Aida staff) and on the river bank to the rear of the Aida factory. This is being done now before the bird nesting season to ensure no delays in construction work when the purchase is completed.

Council Optimism

The Council are now, however, optimistic that the purchase of the factory site will be completed in the next few weeks – although as in any house or property purchase nothing can be taken for granted. Immediately after the purchase the building to the rear of the original factory will be demolished and work on the flood defences will commence.

The Council has received expressions of interest from developers in the site and they intend to sell the site to a developer quite quickly following their acquisition and partial demolition of it.

If, however, the purchase of the site fails to materialise the Council will then be in a position to explore and instigate legal enforcement proceedings to gain access to the site in order to construct the flood defences.

.. to take place after the purchase of the Aida site and be part of a sequence of demolition work on City Road.

Completion date?

A revised earliest date for the completion of the flood defences is now September 2018. Because of the delays, the landscaping, grass seeding and tree planting etc will be taking place in September.

As we all have been doing, continue to watch this space...
