Speed Calming on City Road

Results from the local plan survey of Chester Green residents by the LCRA in 2010, showed that over 70% of respondents agreed that speed calming measures were needed, particularly on City Rd, and also that they would support 20 mph zones in the area. A speed and volume check on City Rd was carried out over a two week period in 2012. It showed on average, 2500 vehicle journeys per day, of which, between 20% to 33% were travelling at more than 30mph, with some recorded in excess of 60 mph. A count of pedestrians, children and cyclists crossing City Rd at the council car park area (next to Parkers Piece) during the 8.00am – 9.00am rush hour on one morning, recorded over 80 people; during the equivalent hour there were over 90 vehicles speeding along City Rd. As a result of campaigning by the LCRA, the Darley Ward Neighbourhood Board have agreed for 2014/15, to prioritise the investigation of the feasibility of speed calming measures on City Rd, and a possible pilot 20mph zone scheme in the Old Chester Rd/City Rd area. Highways officers at Derby City Council have been tasked to respond with proposals for suitable schemes to be consulted on in the future.

Meeting to discuss Local Schooling concern

The aim of the meeting is to clarify issues such as availability of places and sibling priority, with a view to deciding how best to progress resolution of any problems. A council planning officer has decided on the planning application to vary the opening hours and allow use of the rear garden. Approval has been granted to extend opening hours to 11.00pm daily (previously 10.00pm). Use of the rear outside garden by customers has **NOT** been approved; with reasons given that this would be highly likely to lead to increased levels of noise and general disturbance to neighbouring residential properties in close proximity.
