'Flood Re' scheme may help you find Affordable Insurance

The 'Flood Re' scheme, a not for profit insurance fund managed by the insurance industry started in April.

It aims to ensure UK homes at the highest risk of flooding can obtain affordable flood cover. The flood element of a home policy will be priced according to Council Tax band, from £210 for band A, to £1200 for band H. Leasehold, let and commercial properties are excluded, as are homes built after 2009.

If you've had problems getting 'affordable' flood insurance or want to find alternative quotes, the British Insurance Brokers Association (BIBA) www.biba.org.uk has a 'find a broker' service. If you add your postcode, select buildings/contents insurance and that you are in a flood zone you will be shown a map with brokers who can help you.

If you don't have internet access, you can ring BIBA's 'find a broker' service on 0370 950 1790. Many insurance brokers are registering with the 'Flood Re' insurance scheme, so ring them for a quote. Where previously, brokers were quoting high premiums and excesses, or were reluctant to quote at all, the Flood Re scheme should result in a much more competitive market, as brokers can pay for flood repairs from a fund created by a levy on all house insurers.

Residents Parking Scheme

In order to clarify what is happening we wrote to the council asking it to confirm:
♦ that parking permits will be paid for by the Council's Our City Our River (OCOR) team for the whole of the period when visitors car parks in Chester Green are closed, not just the two years as stated in the letter to residents in October.

♦ that residents will be asked if they want to keep the scheme and pay for permits as we approach the end of the free period.

Steven Millington (Senior Traffic

Technician) has asked for his written reply to be in the newsletter—so here it is.

"The cost of administering the parking scheme and the free permits will be supported by the OCOR project until the visitor car parks are re-commissioned, this indeed may be beyond the 2 year lifetime of the existing permits. Residents will be informed of car park status and timescales as the project progresses. We are currently clarifying the timetable for the visitor car park provision as the works progress to the Darley Fields area and will share the information as soon as we can.

After the end of the objection period (this summer), we will consider all objections and write to the residents asking them whether they agree to the parking scheme continuing in force indefinitely i.e. until visitor car parks are recommissioned.

If the decision is taken to not continue the scheme, the residents parking restriction will be removed before the 18 months lapses (June 2017). If the decision is taken to continue the scheme for an indefinite period of time i.e. until visitor car parks are re-commissioned consultation will be carried out with residents prior to the free permits provided by the OCOR project expire, with the scheme being revoked (either in its entirety or in part) if there is no support for it...."

If you have suggestions on how to improve and amend the parking scheme please write to the council (before 3rd July 2016) and please do post a copy to 102 Chester Green Rd, 49 Marcus St. or 1 St. Pauls Rd and include a contact number. This will help us represent your views when we ask for a meeting with the council to discuss amendments to the Parking Scheme.

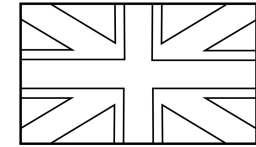
